



VOLUNTEER FAIR CONNECTS THE COMMUNITY Celebrating 16 Years of Helping Northwest Indiana

The annual Volunteer Fair & Blood Drive, sponsored by the Crown Point Community Foundation, has been connecting nonprofits and potential volunteers for 16 years. Held annually at Crown Point High School, the Volunteer Fair gathers dozens of nonprofits together in one place, giving community members the unique chance to learn about the groups' missions and volunteer opportunities in one convenient location.

"The Fair is a great opportunity to match volunteers with nonprofits and to learn about the important work they do in our community," said Mary Nielsen, Crown Point Community Foundation President. "It's one of our biggest events of the year."

To celebrate the Volunteer Fair's 16th annual event, the CPCF will be awarding five grants for \$1,000 each to randomly-selected participating organizations at the conclusion of the Fair. Over 40 nonprofits are scheduled to participate. The nonprofits value the opportunity to not only connect with the community, but also with colleagues from other nonprofits.

In addition to the Volunteer Fair, there will be an onsite Blood Drive conducted by Versiti Blood Centers. "Donating blood is easy but essential. It's another way to be of service," Nielsen said.

New to the fair this year is the Northwest Indiana Volunteer Hub.

Sponsored by Lakeshore Public Media, the Northwest Indiana Volunteer Hub is a free, transformative online tool and app for residents and local nonprofits, to help organizations streamline the volunteer process. With features including profile creation, event listing, volunteer hour tracking, and scheduling, organizations can now more effectively harness the power of their volunteers to advance their missions and serve the community. By providing a centralized platform to explore volunteer opportunities, residents can sign up for shifts, track their contributions, and will be empowered to engage more meaningfully with the causes they care about.

"Lakeshore is beyond excited to launch the Northwest Indiana Volunteer Hub and share it with our fellow nonprofits as well as individuals throughout the Region who are looking for opportunities to improve their community through volunteer service," said Lakeshore Public Media Vice President of Development Carl Kurek.


